Village Elections: Polling place is the Brownsville Community Center (formerly club) 871 Main St., accessed by south entrance. Election Day Poles are open 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. In Wisconsin registration and acceptable ID is required to vote. Village Dept. of Public Works: Supt. Adam Lechner 920-583-6700, Asst. Supt. Troy Kemmel 920-948-5030 They are also in charge of the Water Dept. and Sewer Dept.

Village Water & Sewer: Meters are read quarterly for billing. Bills are issued quarterly and become due and payable upon issuance following the period for which service is rendered. A late payment charge of 3 percent will be added to bills not paid within 20 days of issuance. This one-time 3 percent late payment charge will be applied only to any unpaid balance for the current billing period's usage. The utility customer may be given written notice that the bill is overdue no sooner than 20 days after the bill is issued. Unless payment or satisfactory arrangement for payment is made within the next 10 days, service may be disconnected pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code ch. PSC 185. Charges may be applied for reconnection. An amount owed by the customer may be levied as a tax as provided in Section 66.069 WI Statutes. Payments not honored by Financial Institution shall be assessed a \$20.00 charge when a payment rendered for utility service is not honored by the customer's financial institution. This charge may not be in addition to, but may be inclusive of, other such charges when the payment was for multiple services.

Rates for Water: Quarterly Service Charge: 5/8-inch meter \$42.00, 1-inch meter \$48.00, 2-inch meter \$99.00 Plus Volume Charges: First 30,000 gal. used each qtr. \$5.70 per 1,000 gal., next 170,000 gal. used each qtr. \$5.60 per 1,000 gal., over 200,000 gal. used per qtr. \$4.60 per 1,000 gal.

Rates for Sewer: Quarterly Service Charge: \$26.46 plus volume charges of \$8.10 per 1,000 gal. used each qtr.

Hydrant Flushing: Watch for posted notification.

Brush Pick-up: 1st and 3rd Mondays of the month. Brush should be tied in 4-foot bundles and placed by the curb.

Compost: Residents may drop leaves and grass clippings off at the compost piles located on Southwest corner of the Dale R. Michels Memorial Park. Please read and follow signs. Compost is also available for residents use. Contact Supt. Lechner at 920-583-6700 with questions.

Fall Leaf Pick-up: Leaf burning is prohibited. Watch for posted days for Fall Leaf Pick-up (the Village uses a vacuum truck for this service).

Village Police Dept.: For Emergencies dial 911 Village Marshal Seymour, when on duty, may be reached at 920-583-6800.

Winter Parking: No Parking on Village streets between the hours of 1 a.m. to 7 a.m. after 1" or more of snowfall.







Sidewalk Maintenance: It is the duty of every owner, occupant, agent or person in charge of any premises, improved or vacant within the Village that abuts upon any sidewalk to keep the sidewalk free from rubbish dirt, filth of any kind, SNOW and ICE. Any owner, occupant or agent or person in charge of any premises, improved or vacant, who neglects for the period of twenty-four hours after any rubbish, dirt filth of any kind, snow or ice has been deposited, or formed upon the sidewalk upon which such premises abuts to remove the same shall forfeit a penalty for each and every period of twelve hours during which neglect may continue. The Village Board reserves the right to excuse any person or persons from cleaning their sidewalks of snow where the Board deem it unnecessary. Sidewalks not cleared of snow or ice in a timely manner, may be cleared by the Public Works Dept. and the property owner charged for the work at the rate of \$25 plus 50¢ per foot of sidewalk per incident. This charge may be placed on the tax roll as a lien on the property.

Garbage & Recycling: Weekly Wednesdays (schedule changes usually are posted). Garbage and recycling containers should be at curb by 6 a.m. Bulky pick-up is scheduled twice a year (normally the week after village wide rummage sale dates, May & Oct.). Contact Supt. Lechner at 920-583-6700 with questions or concerns.

Dog Licenses: Dogs over 6 months of age need to be licensed annually. Certification of Rabies Vaccination is required for a license. Pit Bulls are prohibited in the Village (unless certain conditions exist, contact the Police Dept. 920-583-6800 with questions). No more than 2 dogs are allowed per residence unless a exemption is granted by the Board. Contact the clerk for more information at 920-583-4087, email: vobclerk@plbb.us
