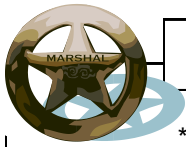
Broadband Survey

From the Marshal's Desk

*State law allows for school buses to use a combination of amber and red flashing lights when stopping to pick up/drop off children. Buses using the amber pre-stopping lights will activate them prior to stopping the bus. Once stopped the red flashing lights will be activated. Drivers must stop a minimum of 20 feet from any school bus stopped with its red lights flashing.

*For those of you that will be participating in Trick-or-treat activities this year, I would like to remind you that costumes can present hazards for children wearing them if they restrict the child's ability to see clearly while wearing them. Please remind your children to use sidewalks when available and to watch for vehicles before crossing the street. Costumes with reflective material on them increase the visibility of your child for motorists under low light conditions.

*As temperatures cool and winter approaches, Wisconsin motorists will soon face wet leaves on Village streets along with frost and snow on roadways and on vehicles windows. Please drive at an appropriately reduced speed when slippery conditions exist. Take the time to clear all windows of snow or frost along with vehicle headlights and tail lamps before driving. Remember to manually turn on headlamps during the day when it is foggy, raining or snowing.

*I would like to remind all village residents and guests that parking is prohibited on all Village streets November 1st to April 15th from 1:00am to 7:00am whenever 1 inch or more of snow falls. Your cooperation in not parking on the streets during snow events is appreciated.

Public Works

A reminder that burning of leaves is prohibited in the Village. Leaves may be taken to the Village compost pile behind the back ball diamond, southwest in the park, or raked to the curb for a scheduled fall leaf vacuum pick-up.

"Non-flushables"

Plastic items, "flushable wipes", paper towels, feminine hygiene product, all can cause problems with the wastewater collection system. Do not flush these products. They increase costs for the Sewer Dept. due to the amount of preventive maintenance needed to be performed on the sanitation equipment.

FALL LEAF PICK-UP

Scheduled dates:

Thursdays

Please do not place leaves in the street prior to the weeks of pick-up. *Dates are subject to change due to weather, etc.* Avoid adding other material (yard waste, sticks, vines). Questions? Ask DPW Supt. Lechner 920-583-6700

Waste Management - Bulk Pick-Up Brownsville: Scheduled for 10/13/2021

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS: *All items must be able to be handled by 2 people without risk of injury.*

- Furniture
- Mattresses
- Scrap Lumber (4ft lengths bundled)
- Carpet (4ft rolled lengths)
- Storm Windows & Doors
- Metal (tire rims, swing sets, pipes, etc)
- LUMBER is not to exceed 4 ft in length nor weigh more than 50lbs
- LATEX PAINT CANS are acceptable *ONLY* if the covers are removed and the contents have been dried to a *SOLID* form.

NON-ACCEPTABLE ITEMS:

- Appliances
- Electronics (Televisions, Computer Components, Radios, Cell Phones, etc.)
- Fluorescent Light Bulbs or Ballasts
- Batteries
- Waste Oil
- Tires, Auto Parts or Machinery
- Liquides (Oil, Paint, Chemicals, etc.)
- Yard Waste or Compost
- Waste from demolition projects done by a contractor
- Hazardous Waste and Asbestos
- Ashes or Hot Materials
- Roofing materials
